COC's FYE PROGRAM OVERVIEW-15 minutes

FYE (First Year Experience) is a comprehensive program for entering freshmen from the Hart District. The program includes:

- ✓ Students will complete an online COC application after April 1, 2011
- ✓ Students will complete an online COC FYE application after their outreach session
- ✓ Students will complete the *online* COC orientation
- ✓ FYE Cougar Days are June 6-9, 2011: Understanding the Placement process, taking a career assessment to identify career interests, choosing a major, learning about Honor program and meeting COC faculty. Students will register for Cougar Days on the FYE website
- ✓ Students will take placement tests to establish appropriate levels of English and Math to prepare for registration in July 2011. Placement tests need to be completed before July 7, 2011.
- ✓ Students will register for Orientation on the FYE website (Provide Handout with web address)
- ✓ FYE Orientation to College, July11-14, 2011: Learning College expectations by meeting with college students, campus tour, new student advisement with College counselors, first semester course planning, registration & payment for classes.
- ✓ Class Cohorts: Students attend fall with other FYE students in English, Math and Counseling classes. Students will also enroll in one GE course (non-FYE designated)
- ✓ Spring 2012: Students will enroll in additional English/Math classes (8 units) up through ENGL 091 and MATH 070.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR FYE?

- ✓ Students who place in below transfer levels of Math and/or English.
- ✓ English course eligibility includes: ENGL 071, 081 and 091/094.
- ✓ Math course eligibility includes: MATH 025, 058, 060 and 070.
- ✓ Students who test at higher levels of English and Math will be asked to consider becoming part of the Honors program.

- OTHER REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION
 - ✓ Students will be required to enroll in 12.0 units (Math, English, Counseling and one GE/CTE class)
 - ✓ Math/English faculty will serve as mentors
 - ✓ Students will be required to attend supplemental learning workshops and/or GLAs during the enrolled semesters.
 - ✓ Students will be required to attend other orientation and student success events
