The exam will be given on **Saturday, May 12th**. Some UC-bound seniors are exempt and do not need to take this exam if they have ON FILE with the UCs an acceptable score on 1) the SAT, 2) the ACT w/writing test, 3) the AP exam for either AP Lang or AP Lit, or 4) an IB exam (we do not have IB exams at Canyon). INTERESTED IN GOING AWAY FOR COLLEGE BUT DON'T HAVE A LOT OF MONEY? Butte College is in Oroville (northern California), and it is a great gateway college to many respected universities. Total annual enrollment and fees are \$5,884 compared to about \$15,000 for Chico state or San Diego State, or about \$37,000 for UCLA or US Berkeley. Total costs w/ living costs are \$16,000. (the CSUs are about \$30,000 and the UCs are over \$54,000). Butte also has over 100 degree and certificate programs. You can contact Cindy Phelps in the admissions office at phelpsci@butte.edu

SENIORS: The SCV Association of California School Administrators is offering multiple scholarships ranging from 200 to 500 dollars.
