It is in the San Miguel Hall and Anacampa Hall. It is free to the public and one of the largest colleges fair in the country, with 150 colleges attending.

The other one the **Pasadena National College Fair** and is for the Greater Los Angeles Area. A student can attend EITHER Monday, April 30, from 6 - 9pm or Tuesday, May 1st from 9am to 12pm. It is in the Pasadena Convention Center Halls A & B. It is free to the public and this is the largest college fair in the country, with **250 colleges attending**.

Also watch the video about the fair so that you can decide what you want to do or see. There will be college reps, workshops, one-on-one college counseling, and more.
